- **What is the deadline for Voter Registration?** Voter Registration closes on Friday, October 12, 2018. If you miss this deadline, you can register and vote on the SAME DAY during Early Voting.
- **Why should I Vote Early?** If there is any problem with your voter registration, you can register the same day that you vote during early voting. That means you can change your address, register for the first time, or change your name.
- **What do I need to take with me when I register on the same day that I vote early?** You will need to bring an official document (like driver’s license, student ID, current bank statement, or utility bill showing your name and current address) and know the last four digits of your Social Security number.
- **Can I vote absentee ballot?** Yes, any registered voter can. First, either request an absentee ballot from the Durham Board of Elections (201 N.
